

OUTSIDE THE ARENA


HOW TO KEEP YOUR HORSE ENGAGED & LEARNING OUTSIDE OF THE ARENA

with Kevin Vesey

When horses come here for training we do our best to get them out of the arena a couple times a week. I have found that this helps improve the endurance on all ages of horses without boring them in the arena. I will cover 3 areas that can be improved upon while enjoying time outside the arena: Endurance, Rate and Steering.

ENDURANCE

When we have a solid stop on the horse, we start to move them outside the arena. These rides will usually cover 4-6 miles at a trot and lope. We ride them down our road ditches, section lines, fields in the fall or spring or anywhere else that has fairly safe footing. These rides will be about 30-45 minutes long and always end by walking the last half mile to the yard. As endurance improves, the chance of injuries is minimized. The minimal mental stress on these rides also keep my horses fresh to eliminate bit chomping, tail wringing, and the bad attitude of a bored horse.

RATE

While on these rides, I do some rate exercises that help with any discipline of arena competition. We usually start at a trot to get your rate set in the horse's mind. Don't be afraid to throw the reins away and let those playful ones trot out. If they break to a lope, don't get frustrated. Just pull them down to the pace you want and hold them there for a few seconds. When you let the reins back out, the speed will probably increase again. Wait until the horse is way too fast or breaking to a lope. Then pull them down again to the desired speed. This may take a few days of just trotting before they stay at the consistent pace, but it will come. The biggest thing is not to hold them at the pace with your hands. Let them get too fast and then pull them back to your speed. This is going to keep their mouth softer. Eventually the tiredness from these rides will make it easier for the horse to stick to a consistent pace.

I have found that using a hum sound as I slow the horse down also increases the responsiveness. The timing of the hum is extremely important. If the rider consistently relaxes their body, followed by a hum before applying pressure on the reins, the horse will eventually break gait and slow down any time we relax our body. For any program, good rate leads to a softer mouth during the high stress steering maneuvers. For instance, many barrel racers I've worked with have found this useful after reaching the timer. They know they can push their horse to the timer, relax, hum, lightly pick up on the reins, and still be safe during a closed gate run.

STEERING

Once our rate is pretty solid, we will use this open space riding to fix some steering issues. In the arena, most riders start to use the sight of the fences instead of feel to know when their horses are dropping their shoulders or ignoring steering commands. Along these rides, I will trot or lope a couple circles every Continue Vesey...

These circles don't have to be perfect like our days training in the arena. They are more to get our horses attention on us and give me some confidence that I have control. I typically know that we are ready to compete when these circles are as good as the arena circles.

I hope that this gives you a few ideas of ways to take your horses outside the arena. I have found it to be a great help when I'm trying to restore or maintain mental soundness, increase endurance, or simply do a bit of training while I enjoy the beauty of my surroundings.


To schedule Clinics or lessons Contact Kevin Vesey Equine Center Baldwin, ND www.Facebook.com/KevinVesey half mile or so. I have found that a few things typically happen while circling:

- If I feel my horse stiffen his jaw, I will keep him bent to the inside and hold his shoulder up until he relaxes. I then head straight out of the circle and move forward down the field.
- If they start to fade towards home, I wouldn't fix him aggressively so as not to scare him. I would just guide them as best as I can for a couple circles and head out again.
- If they forget what the outside rein pressure is, I will throw a few 90-degree turns at any point during the circle and head out again. Keep in mind that these turns need to maintain a consistent pace with the circle, without breaking gate.

Jordon Briggs says she doesn't usually enter slot races—mainly because they are too expensive—and was not entered in the LGPC slot race until just the Sunday before it. The slot owner's horse got hurt and she called Jordon and asked if she wanted to run in it for her.

As luck would have it Jordon's champion horse, Frenchmans Future had just fractured her hock out in the pasture somehow. Right now she is on stall rest for three months and will xray again every 30 days. Right now we are just hoping for a broodmare.

With this going on, Jordon said, "It was a very hard week to say the least. On Monday, Stoli got hurt and I had to leave Tuesday for Kinder. I was pretty out of it. Once I got on Topper and was able to feel her confidence and how ready she felt for her job, it made me step up and try to forget about Stoli for a little while. My horse gave me the confidence I needed. Having your horse ready and feeling prepared is the best mental preparation for your job".

Jordon said, "My long-go run was very smooth and she felt great! She really likes smaller pens, which gave me a lot of confidence to send her harder in the 2nd go of the slot."



About CINNAMON ON TOP...

I had always wanted a prospect or two out of Mr Cinnamon Roll because I loved his full brother so much. So we went to Welch, OK, to see Jimmy Hood and his horses. We ended up talking about buying Mr Cinnamon Roll and Jimmy gave me Topper in the deal as an early yearling.

We are very excited about Mr Cinnamon Roll! We have been breeding him to some great barrel racing mares and I see a very bright future in about 2 or 3 years. He hasn't had very many foals before we bought him. We had a lot of interest in him fast because of what a great outcross site he is.





GOOR GROUND IS NOT BY CHANCE...

By SAF (Safe Arena Footing)

Good ground for rodeo footing is not something that comes about by chance. Just using the local dirt alone and/or with added clay or sand amendments is not likely to produce acceptable equestrian footing material. Of course, arena preparation and soil moisture are critical elements and can even compensate for deficiency in the soil properties.

Critical aspects of arena cushion soil include the proportions of sand, silt, and clay. The distribution of the particle sizes within the sand fraction is a major factor in footing stability. Silt is less desirable in a cushion soil and the proportion of silt compared to clay (as well as total silt+clay content) should be carefully considered.

The size and distribution of sand sizes is evaluated by determining the sand-D₅₀ and the sand- C_u value. The D_{50} is the median particle size or the size in which 50% of the sand is finer than that size and 50% of the sand is larger than that size. The higher the sand-C_u value, the wider is the sand size distribution and the more stable the sand. Finer and more uniform sands tend to be less stable. Typically sand is defined as the particle sizes from 0.05 mm (#270 sieve) and 2.0 mm (#10 sieve) but for the purposes of equestrian footing the range is extended to include the coarser fraction up to 3.35 mm (#6 sieve, technically a fine gravel fraction).

Sands are granular material and the stability of a sand is imparted by grain-tograin interlock and simple friction. The size contrast from 0.05 mm to 3.35 mm is a 67X difference. As coarser sand particles form a certain spatial packing, stability is increased if medium sand particles are also included and reside as material which interpacks within the voids which are created by the coarse particles. If in turn even finer sand grains inter-pack within the void space of the medium sand particles, then stability increases further. While water content increases the cohesion within a sandy skeletal matrix, the influence of moisture (especially higher moisture content) has less of an influence. What this means is that sand tends not to lose its stability with increasing soil moisture content.

Within a sandy skeletal matrix, the addition of silt+clay increases the cohesion between sand grains. This characteristic is primarily from the clay fraction and if the silt content is too high it actually detracts from the cohesiveness of the clay fraction. Thus the silt/clay ratio is as important an aspect as is the total silt+clay. If the silt/clay ratio is too high, the cohesiveness of the clay is negated and the resultant silt+clay is prone to movement via migration and layering features could develop. Ideally, if a properly size and graded sand is utilized, then the addition of a clay amendment (with low or no silt content) is

preferred. A good clay at proper moisture can overcome deficiency in sand size distribution. However, if the clay (or silt-clay) become higher in moisture (reaching what is termed as the "liquid limit") the cohesive and plastic properties of the moist clay are lost and without inherent stability from the sand fraction, then the stability of the entire profile.

In addition to the sand size relationships, the mineralogy and shape of the sand grains are important. A general trend is that more angular grains are most stable. Rounded sand grains are less stable. It is important for the stability of an arena cushion to avoid the extremes of very-angular and round grains (instead using sub-angular to sub-rounded sand grains). Mineralogy is also important in sand grain internal stability. Silica (quartz grains) are the hardest and most stabile while feldspar and mica grains are much less stable. Many sands contain soil carbonates and these minerals may be particularly problematic.

Carbonates are semi-soluble minerals and can cause crusting and soil cementation. The effective solubility of carbonates increases as the grain size of the carbonates decreases. Fine grain carbonates are much more reactive than large grains of carbonates. Carbonates detract from clay cohesive properties.

Use of poor quality water for watering the arena can also promote carbonate accumulation over time. Sodium in the water can also lead to the accumulation of soil carbonates. At the same time, sodium can disperse clay and cause it to lose its cohesiveness. Having an awareness of the water quality and factors for managing the impact of poor quality water are critical.

In short, to have proper materials, which can be managed and prepped for safe footing requires a grasp of ideal cushion soil (target values) and a sampling /testing scheme to evaluate cushion materials against those target values. The best philosophy when it comes to arena footing is to.....







SPOTLIGHT ON... ABBY PURSIFULL-PENSON

Abby headed home last week \$15,000.00 richer! She is a young girl from Texas who is outrunning some of the top trainers and contestants from across the country. She is definitely making heads turn. We asked Abby to give us a run-down of her incredible weekend...

Pearl Snappin was entered in The Patriot Invitational, which is a race for those who have previously entered an American Qualifier this year. It was a straight payout just like the qualifiers. The entry fee was \$500 and \$250 goes to the actual Invitational race and \$250 goes to the Shootout. The Shootout is the top 50 in each division from all four races during the week; the Futurity long go, the Young Guns long go, the Invitational, and both sections of the Open. So, everyone during the week is hoping for a Shootout spot.

Pearl Snappin is an eight year old mare by Ketchum Cowboy and out of a daughter of Peppy San Badger. We bought her as a two year old from the Four Sixes Ranch and I trained her as a four year old. I believe in 'less is more' with her, so I don't do a lot to prepare for a run. This particular day I had her Back On Track wraps on her legs and gave her JailBreak GI by Oxy-Gen. I don't even warm her up very much. She's pretty easy! So for me it was just another run. I think of all runs the same whether I'm at a jackpot or a pro rodeo; I try to just concentrate on letting my horse work and staying out of her way.

I knew from the moment she ate up the first barrel she was about to make a great run. But when I saw it was a 14.626 on the timer as I went into the alleyway, I couldn't believe it. I was so excited. And I was only number 21, so I still had 100 runners left to sit through. It was a very long wait! I watched the rest of the runners from the stands and was pretty nervous. I knew of a few horses that could move me and it was hard to watch as they ran, but we stuck in there and won it. It was a pretty awesome feeling knowing I had just won \$10,000 for the Invitational, and also \$3,000 for second in the Open.

SR My Daddy's N Oil was entered in The Patriot Futurity which was her first one. She had never been to a place quite like Fort Worth. She had never even been somewhere where she had to be stalled overnight. But I knew she had the ability when she got into the arena to run with any of the Futurity horses entered.

SR My Daddy's N Oil is a four year old mare by Frenchmans Guy and out of First Place Easily who is by First Place Dash. She is owned by Scott Andrews of Winnsboro, Texas. He sent her to me late last summer to start and she has been pretty easy to get going. She wants to go work every time you come down the alley.

The top 50 of the futurity long-go make it back to the short-go, and your long-go run also qualifies you for the shootout. There was only 64 runners entered so I just wanted to make sure I had a smooth run and didn't hit a barrel so we would make it back. So that's what we did. She ran a 15.6 just cruising the pattern and worked great, so I was pleased. My short-go run, I knew you would have to make a nice run to place. So I sent her in there hard and she worked great and was a 15.1. I was winning it for a while so I was pretty excited. I ended up 4th and won \$2,000 behind Chris Martin, who is a good friend of mine, Jordan Briggs, and Kassie Mowry. I figured if Dolly could hang with their horses, she was pretty nice! So we were very pleased.

I am 23 years old and recently got married in September to Chris Penson. My maiden name is Pursifull, so when I run there are still a lot of people who don't know who Abby Penson is. We live in Blossom, Texas. I ride outside horses for a living. Most of the ones I ride are young ones that just need to be started. I love starting colts. I also rodeo on Pearl quite a bit. I just love the atmosphere of rodeos and Pearl usually runs better at a rodeo than at barrel races. But, after this week at The Patriot, I'm starting to think I like the futurities and big barrel races better! It would take quite a few rodeos to win \$15,000. But, regardless of where I am, I just enjoy running barrels and plan to do it for as long as I can.

CARE & MANAGEMENT OF THE GROWING FOAL ONE WEEK THROUGH WEANLING - PART 2

In Part 1 of this article, I discussed management and veterinary considerations for the baby foal from birth through one week of age. In this article I continue with some important health considerations for the growing foal from 1 week old to weaning. The period through weaning is a critical time for the developing foal. Healthy growth is critical for horses to reach their full athletic potential.

The young colt from the last article is beginning to eat some of the mare's feed. You notice that he eats manure. He is vigorous, nursing well, and seems to be growing rapidly. You notice that he has some diarrhea still. You also notice that he has what seems to be an abnormal angle of the right front fetlock when viewed from the front. As he grows, you notice swellings appearing just above his fetlock joints.

These are typical observations made by those involved in the care and management of nursing foals. In this article, I address these concerns with emphasis on nutrition and developmental orthopedic disease, what I consider to be the most common problem in this age foal. I also discuss infected joints, vaccination and parasite control.

Proper nutrition is a critical part of managing the nursing foal. At one to two weeks, the foal is eating solid feed in addition to nursing many times per day. The foal sleeps much of the day between meals. Manure eating is normal. The foal populates his intestine with the essential bacteria and protozoa in the mare's manure. At two weeks, foal heat diarrhea is usually resolving, but a small degree of diarrhea may last for weeks and still be considered normal.



RAPID GROWTH

Up to six weeks of age, most of the foal's nutrition comes from milk. Starting at six weeks and through weaning the mare's milk production gradually declines and the foal eats more and more solid feed. The most common nutritional problem for foals of this age is over-nutrition and excessively rapid growth. Foals drink large quantities of milk and in addition are often being supplemented, or are eating the mare's grain. Excess energy

in the feed causes the foal to grow faster than it should. This causes problems for the developing musculoskeletal system.

These problems are grouped into a category known as Developmental Orthopedic Disease (DOD). The syndromes that make up DOD mostly involve problems with the lengthening of bones with growth. This process involves converting soft cartilage to bone in a lengthening section of the bone known as the growth plate (physis). There are areas of enlargement in the bone accounting for both increased length of the bone (physis) and enlargement of the joint (epiphysis). Physitis affects growth of the lengthening long bone at the growth plate. Osteochondrosis (OCD) affects growth of the bone underlying the joint. This syndrome is also associated with "Wobbler Syndrome," spinal compression from abnormally developed vertebrae in the neck.

Physitis is caused by defective bone growth at the physis, or the area where bones are lengthening. This causes swelling, pain and may cause lameness. This problem can also be related to angular limbs through excessive loading of one side of the growth plate. A foal afflicted by physitis might seem sore and stiff, and have visible swellings, usually above the joints of multiple limbs. In the young foal these swellings are mostly just above the fetlock joints.

Osteochondrosis is caused by defective bone formation in the area directly under a joint. This causes a faulty foundation for the joint, allowing the joint surface to be irregular or even collapse, causing eventual lameness and arthritis. This problem often is not discovered until training commences.

Excessively rapid growth may cause these problems the following ways:

- Overweight foal. Subjecting the delicate bone lengthening process to too much weight per unit area.
- Excessive Exercise. Moderate exercise is critical to healthy foal development. Foals that are fed a high-energy diet play more than foals that are fed a more moderate diet. This excessive exercise may irritate the physis by overloading it.

 Inadequate Nutrients. Excessive rate of growth at the growth plate may outpace the availability of other nutrients needed for healthy bone growth.

Growth-related problems can also result from other factors such as:

- Lameness in one limb can cause overload of the growth plates in the other limb.
- Genetics likely plays a role both in the tendency to have physitis/ OCD and in the potential for growth.
- Under-nutrition and improper mineral balance. Protein deficiency and imbalances of levels of calcium, phosphorus, copper and zinc have all been found to be involved in the development of some cases of DOD.

PREVENTION OF DEVELOPMENTAL ORTHOPEDIC DISEASE – DOD

Over-nutrition is the most common cause of developmental orthopedic disease. A foal generally cannot consume enough grass hay to cause a problem. Over-nutrition usually results when the foal is supplemented with additional grain or alfalfa or is eating too much of the mare's grain or alfalfa.

- Do not overfeed foals. Pay attention to body condition of mare and foal. If necessary, separate mare and foal for supplementation as needed.
- Provide balanced nutrition. There are now many commercial, pelleted feeds designed for the growing foal. These generally have a good balance of energy, protein and necessary minerals. I recommend using these products rather than grains and large quantities of alfalfa to supplement foal diets.
- Know the signs of DOD and be on the lookout for them. Deal with them promptly by contacting your vet right away.
- Genetics: Breed individuals that do not have a history of these problems.

Careful observation is key. It is very important to observe your foal's legs as it grows and to know normal "correct" conformation. Flexural and angular limb deformities are deviations from correct limbs. Flexural deformities refer to abnormalities you can see when viewing the limbs from the side. Flexural deformities usually affects the joints of the lower limb and can appear at birth or be acquired, developing with time. Flexural deformities relate to a relative shortening of the flexor tendons of various joints. An example of a flexural deformity is "Club Foot." This is an abnormally upright hoof, which can be severe enough that the heel may be off the ground.

Angular limb deformities are abnormal angulations at joints, visible from the front or back. Your veterinarian can help you decide which of these problems will resolve spontaneously and which require treatment. Treatment for flexural deformities and angular limbs depends on the case and may involve exercise restriction, splinting, medications, surgery or a combination of these treatments.

The most important thing you can do is to recognize that these problems exist and know what to look for. If you have questions, call your veterinarian promptly. Early treatment of developmental limb problems is the key to their successful management. Delay causes irreversible change as the growth plates "close." This starts happening in very early life, depending on the specific growth plate in question. In addition to evaluation by a veterinarian, foals with angular limb and flexural deformities should have their feet trimmed and balanced regularly by an experienced farrier.

OTHER IMPORTANT MANAGEMENT CONSIDERATIONS

Young foals with severe lameness should be examined promptly by a veterinarian. A common cause of severe lameness in foals is septic arthritis (infected joint). An infected joint is a life-threatening problem and must be treated aggressively and correctly. This catastrophic problem usually results from spread of bacteria into the blood from intestinal, umbilical, and other infections. These blood borne bacteria then seed the joints, starting infection.



Continue Thal...

Always keep an eye on the young foal's umbilical area for swelling or drainage. Be aware that even if you cannot see swelling of the umbilicus, infection can exist, allowing bacteria into the blood.

FOAL VACCINATIONS

Foals out of mares that are current on their vaccinations should be vaccinated the first time at four months for Encephalitis, Tetanus and West Nile Virus. Keep in mind that all foals require a second booster shot three to six weeks after the first. Studies suggest that it is best to wait to vaccinate foals for influenza and rhinopneumonitis until they are 6-12 months old. Other vaccines may be given based on advice of your veterinarian.

There is a reason not to vaccinate foals too early. A newborn foal gets its immunity from the mare's colostrum or first milk. The concentrated antibodies from this colostrum are absorbed during the first day of life and this antibody is protective for the first few months of life. Giving a vaccine while these antibody levels are high is counterproductive. The vaccine itself (which is a prepared part of the actual virus) becomes bound up by the antibody in the foal's blood. In this way both antibody and vaccine are used up, leaving the foal unprotected against disease. Foals out of mares not currently vaccinated should have their vaccination program started at two months instead.

PARASITE CONTROL

Parasite control in the young foal is important. Young foals are very susceptible to internal parasites. I recommend monthly small doses (by weight) of safe products (ivermectin alternating with pyrantel is an example), beginning at one month of age and through a year. The foal's mother and any herd mates should be on an every two month worming schedule as well. It is important that this is coordinated with the foal's schedule.


The period through weaning is a critical time for the young foal's development. Careful management of nutrition and prevention of DOD during this time is important to maximize future athletic potential. Other important considerations discussed here are vaccinations and parasite control, but this article only touches on a few important aspects. There are many other factors that must be considered in perfecting management of the growing foal. The better the management, the better the likelihood of producing a weanling that reaches its full potential for development and future performance.



HOW TO BUY A HORSE

If there are a million ways to buy a bad horse, there must be at least five ways to buy a good one. To get a good horse, you have to use a little horse sense. Hard to do, being human. Emotion usually gets the best of us.

It's natural to be anxious and excited by the thrill of owning a new horse. But whoa, hold it, shorten the reins! I know the horse is beautiful, and the story that goes with him is reasonable, and he may be sold tomorrow. But you asked, so accept this fact: buyer beware!

Before you start looking for a horse, determine what it is you want. Write down your requirements. Your list should include breed, age, size, amount of training, color, sex, price and suitability for performing in your area of interest. Only you know the answers, and you are the one who must be satisfied. Knowing what it is you want gives you a direction in which to search. Bargain horses usually aren't bargains, so beware of sad stories, auctions and the fast deal.

Your horse may be anywhere, but there is a good chance he is with a professional trainer who specializes in your area of interest. A well-known trainer has a reputation to protect, and seldom, if ever, will he let you get stuck with a bad horse, or a horse he thinks won't fit your needs. Make appointments to see horses, which fit your criteria, and then go see them—all of them. The first horse you see may be the one you want, but see the others so you'll know what you don't want.

Here is the first rule: follow your heart. You will know almost instantly upon seeing a horse if it is one you should consider. If your heart says, "yes, yes," and the next four tests are passed, this is your horse. If there is the slightest doubt in your heart, after four more tests, this is not the horse for you. You'll find your horse, if you listen to your heart.

Second test: study the person selling the horse, and take a good look at the horse's surroundings. If the seller is neat, clean and takes some pride in himself and his facility, then he probably cares for his horses in much the same manner. Ask to see the horse in his stall or pen. Wood chewers and cribbers leave tell-tale signs. So do weavers, stall walkers and hole diggers. Bad habits are physically hard on a horse's condition and health, and they are always hard to break. You don't want those problems.

Ask to see the horse turned out so he can run free and you can see how he moves and uses his body. The horse should be happy to see people, curious, but not jumpy. He should have a clear, bright eye and should be smoothly put together.

The horse's conformation should be pleasing to you. Conformation faults or less than desirable traits for the performance which interests you can be pointed out during a vet check. If you have conformation questions, be sure to tell your veterinarian exactly what you intend to do with the horse.

The third test is for performance ability and training. Of course, if you are looking at a horse not yet trained to a saddle, then you won't be riding. But you certainly can watch the horse being lunged, tied, groomed and handled. Note carefully the horse's ground manners. If the horse is performance trained, the seller may wish to ride the horse first to show off the horse's talents. This is fine because it gives you another chance to make some observations. If the seller is a bad rider, chances are the horse has had a bad start and much re-schooling is ahead. If the seller jerks, bangs, spurs or hits the horse, pack up. You don't want that bundle of trouble. If you decide to ride, then the secret of the test is to see how responsive the horse is to your cues, and how relaxed the horse is as he performs. You

want a partner with a good attitude and a willingness to learn. If the horse is already a champion, then you want a super pleasant attitude to go with his performance record.

The fourth test is the vet check. You only want to know a few things. How is the horse's breathing, his heart, and does he have obvious soundness problems? (Look at the horse's shoes--special shoes mean special problems.) If there are soundness problems, you want to know how to manage them. Don't ask for and don't accept a pass-fail examination. You want information to consider, not someone else's choice of horses. You need to make the final decision; it is your responsibility. There is no way to predict the future or the soundness of a horse, so don't try. Accept the uncertainty and enjoy what you have at the moment.

The final test is price. You set your price before you starting looking, so there should be no question now. If there is, what happened? Don't overpay! If you feel you have overpaid for the horse, the horse is going to suffer in any number of ways. Don't over-extend yourself financially. On the other hand, if you can afford the price, buy the horse. A horse is worth exactly what you believe he's worth, and happy to pay. There's no price limit on a perfect friendship.

TRAINING TIP!

COUNTER BENDING

with Diane Helmin

COUNTER BENDING is a way to create suppleness and teach a horse to use his inside hind leg, which engages his hindquarters for power. A counter-bend asks the horse to bend in the opposite direction of the actual turn.

To teach your horse this maneuver, the horse should already have good forward motion and give laterally. I will explain with a right hand turn in mind. Keep your hands fairly far apart leaving quite a bit of rein between your hands. First, lift with your left rein while pulling gently upward but stay in the area of an imaginary line from the left side of the pommel and the saddle horn, without crossing over the neck. This rein should be fairly close to the neck of the horse. Your left leg should be adding some pressure next to the girth. Your right leg should be away from the horse allowing him to move in a right circle or direction. Your right rein should be away from the right side of the neck helping to redirect your horse in the same direction. Your hands will control the amount of bend in the spine.

Both of your reins can be used at slightly different times causing a see-saw motion to keep your horse light. Either of your hands and your left leg can reinforce the move to the right as needed. When the horse makes an attempt to move to the right with his body slightly bent to the left, release pressure. This release will help your horse understand he has made the right move that you were asking for. As your horse understands the move, you can hold the position longer and longer.

I start the counter-bend in very large circles and spiral down and up as the horse starts to understand the move. This maneuver can be very beneficial to help teach a horse to finish and power out of their turns.

If your horse loses too much forward motion when asking for the counter arc position, release and reinforce forward motion. Eventually they will be able to put the two together.




